University of Birmingham, Dubai

we were contracted by the developers to work on a 46mts, 18 mts and 12 mts long truss erection. out team used a 250t /72505 Kobelco crawler to lift weights of up to 28 tones. The main reason this was used is to avoid project delay from having to reposition the tower crane and also because a crawler crane



Marina event, Dubai

We were contracted for the Assembly and erection of 40m x 70m tent and for this we used two of our 660SJ AWP machines and one 80T mobile crane to complete the job.



Dgum desalination Plant, Oman

Our 860S) man lift was used for manual structural wok at a height at this desalination plant. This Independent Water Project IWP, is part of a joint project to bring new water and then electricity in the form of a new power plant to the Dugm area of Oman which needs them due to its rapid growth already and expected growth in the future



Raha International School, Abu Dhabi

The project needed to be completed in a six month time frame so the best option was to use three crawler cranes due to their maneuverability and capabilities to work in congested area, fast and efficient. We have 150t, 250t and 280t crawler cranes currently on site which is covering 95% of the precast erection required for the project



Expansion of our fleet to have 1000 Aerial work platforms

We are not only expanding our fleet but also increasing our foot print in Oman

After successfully navigating the tough markets in 2020 we have proved to be a leader in the rental industry and in now expanding our fleet.

We are currently awaiting the delivery of 112 machines to complement our existing fleet across the group. The up to date models manufactured by both JLG and Genie will start to arrive this month and will continue to arrive in batches over the next three months.

This investment by Johnson Arabia strengthens the company's ambition to get to fleet size of 1000 machines by the close of 2021. The majority of purchased machines will be delivered to our new depot in Muscat and our existing location in Duqm and the remaining units will be delivered to the UAE, to help fulfil the growing demand.

"Research indicates that the AWP market size was over \$17.5 billion globally in 2019 and is estimated to grow at over 6% between 2020 and 2026. We imagine a lot of rental opportunities coming our way in 2021 in the region because stalled projects across the GCC will restart at full capacity soon and there will be infrastructure upgrades, especially in the telecom and communication sectors. As postponed events return, the events sector will need access platforms and so will many other sectors, and we have the ability to rent to them easily because of our large fleet size," says Gareth Conley, Executive Manager AWP.

Project Spotlight

Al Arjan Residential Project

A recent application of Maeda mini cranes was in a residential building in the Arjan area of Dubai. An MC405C was employed to erect columns on the podium for construction of a kids play area.

The spider crane was lifted from the ground to the podium by using a 100t crane and positioned on the podium slab.

The two-day job saw the MC285C-3 lift loads up to 900 kg to a height of up to 12m and working radius of 5m. The MC405C has a maximum capacity of 3.83 tonnes at 2.7m; maximum working radius of 16m for 0.21 tonne; and maximum lifting height of 16.8m.

"If the same job was to be executed from the ground level, the client would have had to spend at least AED30,000 additionally. We were able to provide a much cheaper and faster option with the Maeda spider mini crane. After completion of the job, the MC405C was lowered to the ground by using another crane," says Mohammad Fareed, Executive Manager for Cranes.
